Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabrics A and G, cut:

two 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 1-1/2" squares

From Fabric B, cut:

five 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then set aside for Border 1.
five 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 1-1/2" squares
forty 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric C, cut:

six 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles
forty 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric D, cut:

eight 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles
forty 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric E, cut:

six 4" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then set aside for Border 3.
eleven 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles
forty 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles

From Fabric F, cut:

twelve 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
eighty 1-1/2" x 5-1/2" rectangles

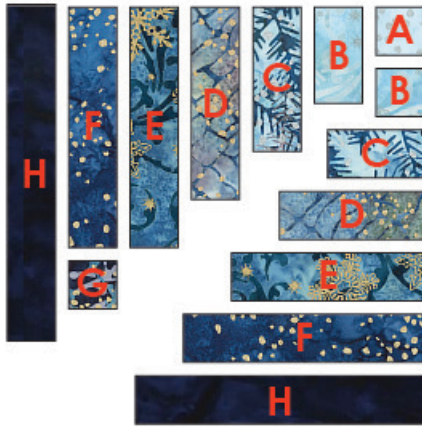
From Fabric H, cut:

eighteen 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
forty 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles
forty 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangles
five 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then set aside for Border 2.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Blocks



Step 1: Gather:

- one 1-1/2" Fabric A square
- one of each of the Fabric B square and rectangle
- one of each length of the Fabric C rectangles
- one of each length of the Fabric D rectangles
- one of each length of the Fabric E rectangles
- two Fabric F rectangles
- one 1-1/2" Fabric G square
- one of each length of the Fabric H rectangles

Arrange the units as shown. Note the fabric placement in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 2: Sew the Fabric B square to the bottom edge of the Fabric A square. Press. Sew the Fabric B rectangle to the left edge of the unit. Press.

Step 3: Sew the 2-1/2" Fabric C rectangle to the bottom edge of the unit. Press. Sew the 3-1/2" Fabric C rectangle to the left edge of the unit. Press.

Step 4: Sew the 3-1/2" Fabric D rectangle to the bottom edge of the unit. Press. Sew the 4-1/2" Fabric D rectangle to the left edge of the unit. Press.

Step 5: Sew the 4-1/2" Fabric E rectangle to the bottom edge of the unit. Press. Sew the 5-1/2" Fabric E rectangle to the left edge of the unit. Press.

Step 6: Sew the 5-1/2" Fabric F rectangle to the bottom edge of the unit. Press. Sew the Fabric G square to one end of the remaining Fabric F rectangle. Press. Sew the 5-1/2" Fabric F/G strip to the left edge of the unit, noting the orientation. Press.

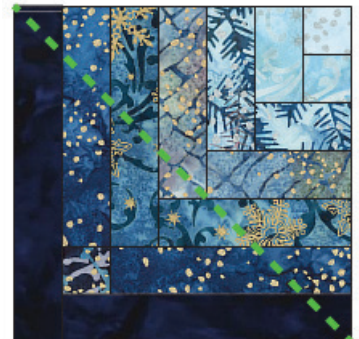


Step 7: Sew the 6-1/2" Fabric H rectangle to the bottom edge of the unit. Press. Sew the 7-1/2" Fabric H rectangle to the left edge of the unit. Press.

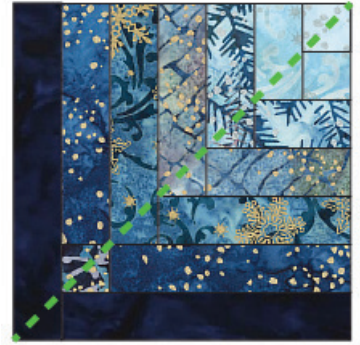
The resulting Block should measure 7-1/2" square. Repeat to make forty Blocks.

Set thirty-one Blocks aside for the Quilt Center.

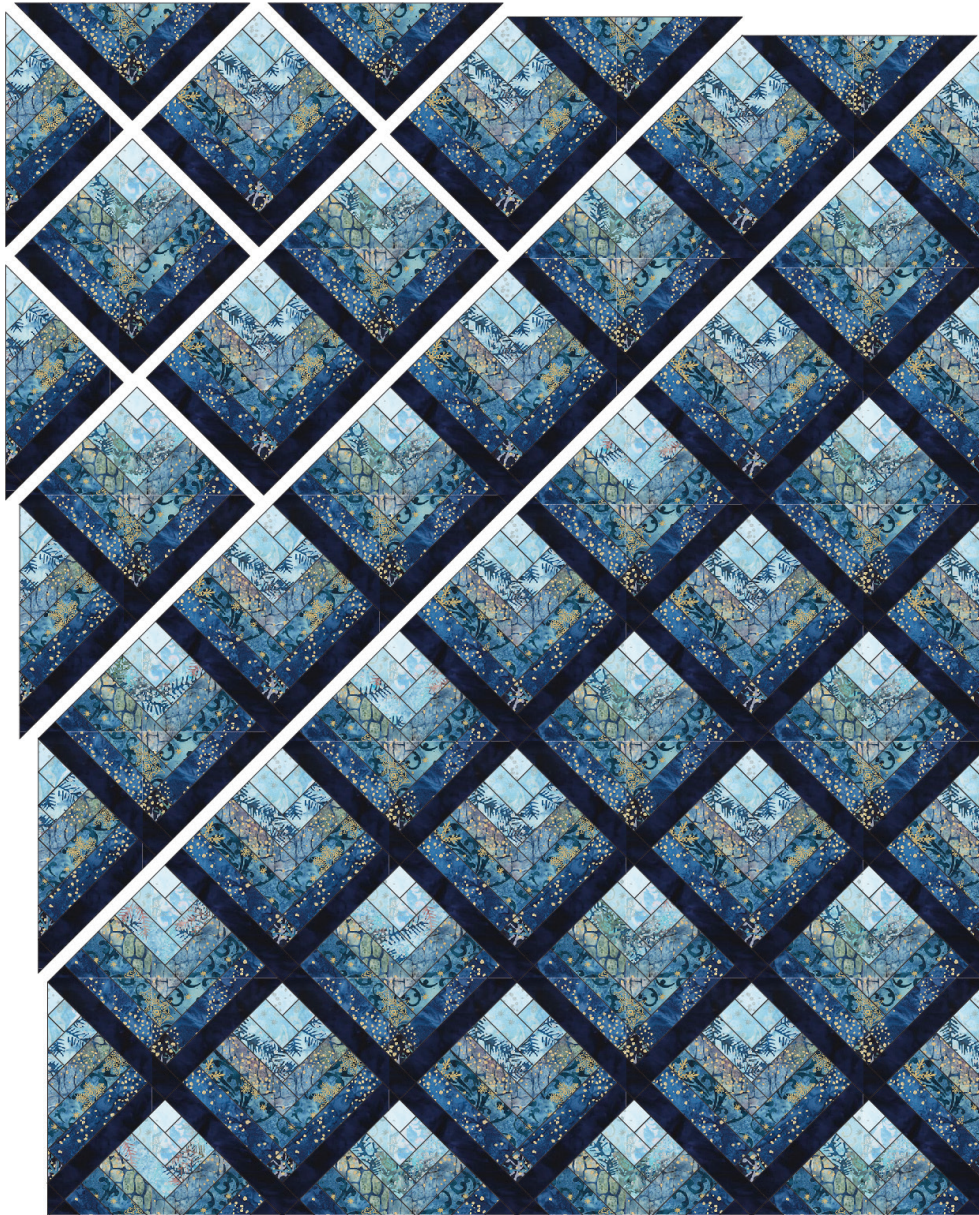
Step 8: Cut four of the remaining Blocks in half as shown. These will become the partial blocks on the top and bottom edges of the quilt center.



Step 9: Cut five of the remaining Blocks in half as shown. These will become the partial blocks on the left and right edges of the quilt center.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 10: Arrange the full and partial blocks as shown, forming diagonal rows. Sew the diagonal rows together, pressing seams in opposite directions every other row. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side.

Step 11: Stitch a line of stay-stitching around the outer edge of the quilt, 1/8" from the Fabric F or Fabric G points of the outermost full blocks.



Step 12: Trim the four edges of the quilt, just beyond the stay stitching, being sure to leave 1/4" beyond the Fabric F or Fabric G points as shown.



Step 13: Measure the length of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric B side Border 1 strips to this length. Sew the borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the border. Measure the width of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric B top/bottom Border 1 strips to this length. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the border.

Step 14: Measure the length of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric H side Border 2 strips to this length. Sew the borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the border. Measure the width of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric H top/bottom Border 2 strips to this length. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the border.

Step 15: Measure the length of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric E side Border 3 strips to this length. Sew the borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the border. Measure the width of the quilt through the center. Cut two Fabric E top/bottom Border 3 strips to this length. Sew the borders to the top and bottom of the quilt center. Press toward the border.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
