Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabrics A-C, cut:

one 3-3/4" x WOF strip. Subcut:
four 3-3/4" x 8" rectangles for the exterior
one 2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
two 2" x 3" rectangles for the zipper tabs

From each of Fabrics D-F, cut:

one 8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
two 8" x 4" rectangles for the accent
two 8" x 10-1/2" rectangles for the lining

From the Woven Interfacing cut:

three 10-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
six 10-1/2" x 8" rectangles


Assemble the Pouch

Step 1: Sew the two exterior pieces to either side of an accent strip, pairing fabrics as shown in the sample. Press and topstitch if desired. Repeat to make three pairs of exterior units.




Step 2: Fuse one rectangle of Interfacing to the wrong side of each completed Step 1 unit, following the manufacturer's instructions.

Step 3: Fold the short ends of the Zipper Tab together and finger press to form a center crease. Unfold. Bring the short ends together to meet at the center crease, wrong sides together. Fold again at the center crease, enclosing the raw edges of fabric to create the Zipper Tab. Repeat to create a second.




Step 4: Trim the zipper tape length to 10", if needed, centering the zipper stops. Attach one Zipper Tab to each end of the zipper, as shown. Trim the width of the Zipper Tab to the width of the zipper, as needed.




Step 5: Place the zipper face down, RST with the top (long) edge of an exterior piece, aligning the raw edges. Sew the zipper in place with a basting stitch and 1/8" seam.



Step 6: Place a lining piece on top, RST. Sew along the top of the unit. Position the fabrics wrong sides together and press the seams away from the zipper. Topstitch along the fabric near the zipper.




Step 7: Repeat the process, placing the remaining exterior piece right side up on the work surface. Place the completed Step 6 unit exterior right side down, aligning the zipper with the top edge of the fabric. Baste in place with a 1/8" seam. Place the remaining lining piece right side down. Sew along the top of the unit. Position the fabrics wrong sides together and press the seams away from the zipper. Topstitch along the fabric near the zipper.



Open zipper half way. This is essential.



Step 8: Place linings right sides together and exteriors right sides together and pin.

Step 9: Sew around entire project, leaving a 4" opening along the bottom center of the lining. Backstitch at both sides of the opening.



Step 10: Turn the pouch right side out, pulling the project through the opening in the lining. Push corners out and tuck the seam allowance in at the opening in the lining. Edgestitch the opening closed.

Repeat the process for the remaining pieces to make a total of three pouches.



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
