Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Half-square triangle has been abbreviated to HST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each of Fabrics A-D, cut:

one 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: four 6-1/2" squares

From each of Fabrics E-H, cut:

three 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: thirty-two 3-1/2" squares for the Flying Geese

From each of Fabrics I-L, cut:

two 4" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 4" squares for the HSTs two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen 3-1/2" squares

From Fabric M, cut:

eleven 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: one hundred twenty-eight 3-1/2" squares for the Flying Geese

From each of Fabrics N-Q. cut:

three 6-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 thirty-two 6-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles for the Flying Geese
two 4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 sixteen 4" squares for the HSTs
two 3-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
 sixteen 3-1/2" squares

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

Step 1: Pair a 4" Fabric I square with a 4" Fabric N square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 3-1/2" square. Repeat to make thirty-two I/N HSTs.



Step 2: Repeat to make:



thirty-two J/O HSTs



thirty-two K/P HSTs



thirty-two L/Q HSTs

Assemble the Flying Geese

Step 3: Place a 3-1/2" Fabric M square RST at one end of a Fabric N rectangle. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square, as shown. Sew on the marked line and trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press toward the triangle.











Step 4: Repeat Step 3 at the remaining end of the rectangle. The resulting flying geese block should measure 3-1/2" x 6-1/2". Make sixteen N/M Flying Geese.











Step 5: Repeat Steps 3 and 4 to make:



sixteen N/E Flying Geese



sixteen P/G Flying Geese



sixteen O/M Flying Geese



sixteen Q/M Flying Geese



sixteen O/F Flying Geese



sixteen Q/H Flying Geese



sixteen P/M Flying Geese

Assemble the Blocks



Step 6: Gather: four Fabric N squares four Fabric I squares eight I/N HSTs four N/M Flying Geese four N/E Flying Geese one Fabric A square

Arrange the units into five rows of five. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 7: Sew the units together to form the rows. Press the seams to the right in the odd numbered rows and to the left in the even numbered rows.

Step 8: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block. Repeat to make a total of four A Blocks.

Step 9: Repeat Steps 6-8 to make a total of four B Blocks, this time pressing the seams in to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows. Repeat to make a total of four B Blocks.



Step 10: Repeat Steps 6-8 to make a total of four C Blocks, this time pressing the seams to the right in the odd numbered rows and to the left in the even numbered rows. Repeat to make a total of four C Blocks using the fabrics shown here.



Step 11: Repeat Steps 6-8 to make a total of four D Blocks, this time pressing the seams to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows. Repeat to make a total of four D Blocks using the fabrics shown here.



Assemble the Quilt



Step 12: Arrange the blocks into four rows of four blocks. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 13: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 14: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
