Fabric Requirements

1/2 yard Natalia-CM4982 Charcoal
 1/2 yard Dot-CM9528 Black
 15/8 yards Dot-CM9528 Red (includes binding)
 1 1/8 yards Hatch-CM2959 Cream
 3/4 yard Natalia-CM4985 Cream
 3/8 yard Natalia-CM4985 Charcoal
 1/2 yard Natalia-CM4986 Black
 2 1/8 yards Natalia-CM4983 Charcoal
 3 7/8 yards Natalia-CM4982 Charcoal (backing)
 68" x 80" batting

Cutting

From Natalia-CM4982 Charcoal (A):

- Cut two 6 1/2" x width-of-fabric (WOF) strips. Sub-cut ten 6 1/2" squares.

From Dot-CM9528 Black (B):

- Cut four 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut twenty 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" strips.
- Cut five 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut twenty 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" strips.

From Dot-CM9528 Red (C):

- Cut five 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut forty 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangles.
- Cut three 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut forty 2 1/2" squares.
- Cut three 5 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut twenty 5 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make eighty triangles.
- Cut seven 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From Hatch-CM2959 Cream (D):

- Cut five 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut eighty 2 1/2" squares.
- Cut two 5 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut ten 5 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make forty triangles.
- Cut four 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 2" x 60 1/2" strips.
- Cut three 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two 2" x 51 1/2" strips.

From Natalia-CM4985 Cream (E):

- Cut five 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut eighty 2 1/2" squares.
- Cut five 2 1/2" x WOF strips.

From Natalia-CM4985 Charcoal (F):

- Cut two 5 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut ten 5 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make forty triangles.

From Natalia-CM4986 Black (G):

- Cut five 2 1/2" x WOF strips.

From Natalia-CM4983 Charcoal (H):

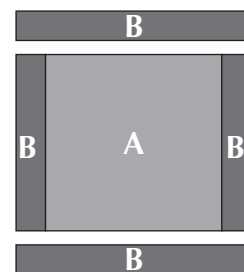
- Cut two 4 1/2" x 75" length-of-fabric (LOF) strips, each centered on the narrow border.
- Cut two 4 1/2" x 63" LOF strips, each centered on the narrow border.
- From the remaining fabric, cut ten 4 1/2" squares, each centered on the wide border.

Block Construction

All seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew one 1 1/2" x 6 1/2" CM9528 Black strip to each side of one 6 1/2" CM4982 Charcoal square. Sew one 1 1/2" x 8 1/2" CM9528 Black strip to the top and another to the bottom of the 6 1/2" CM4982 Charcoal square to make one Unit 1. (*figure 1*) Repeat to make a total of ten of Unit 1.

Unit 1
Make 10.

2. Place one 2 1/2" CM2959 Cream square on the left side of one 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" CM9528 Red rectangle, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (*figure 2*). Flip open the triangle

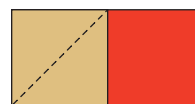
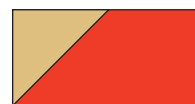

formed and press (*figure 3*). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.



3. Place another 2½" CM2959 Cream square on the right side of the 2½" x 4½" CM9528 Red rectangle, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner. (figure 4) Flip open the triangle formed and press. (figure 5) Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make one Unit 2.

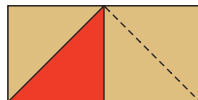
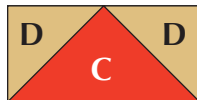

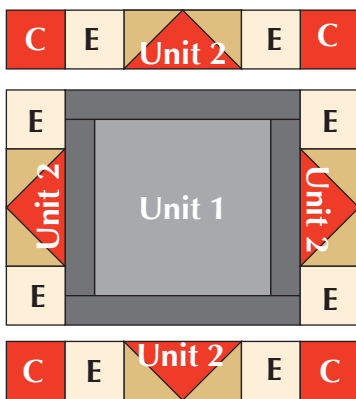


Unit 2
Make 40.

4. Repeat steps 2-3 to make a total of forty of Unit 2.
5. Sew one 2½" CM4985 Cream square to each end of one Unit 2 to make one side strip. Repeat to make a total of forty side strips.

6. Sew one side strip to each side of one Unit 1. Sew one 2½" CM9528 Red square to each end of one side strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew one strip to the top and another to the bottom of the Unit 1 to make one Block One. (figure 6) Repeat to make a total of ten of Block One.

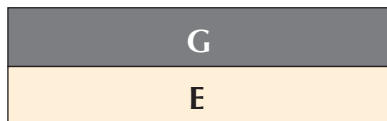

Make 10.

7. Sew the long edges of one 2½" x WOF CM4985 Cream strip and one 2½" x WOF CM4986 Black strip together to make one Cream/Black strip set. (figure 7) Repeat to make a total of five Cream/Black strip sets.

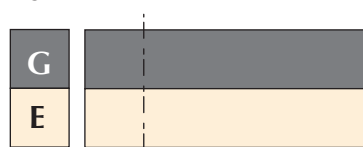

Make 5.

8. Cross-cut the Cream/Black strip sets into a total of eighty 2½" x 4½" Cream/Black rectangles. (figure 8)

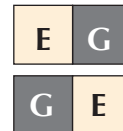

Cut 80.

9. Sew two Cream/Black rectangles together to make one Unit 3 four-patch. (figure 9) Repeat to make a total of forty of Unit 3.

Unit 3
Make 40.

10. Sew two CM9528 Red triangles, one CM2959 Cream triangle and one CM4985 Charcoal triangle together as shown to make one Unit 4. (figure 10) Repeat to make a total of forty of Unit 4.

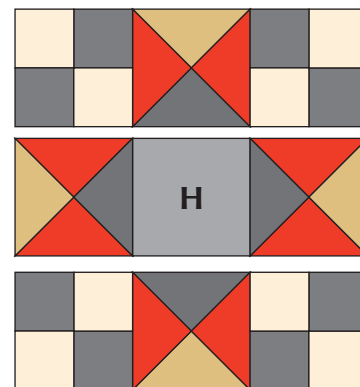

11. Noting the orientation, sew one Unit 4 to each side of one 4½" CM4983 Charcoal square. Sew one Unit 3 to each side of one Unit 4. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew one strip to the top and the other to the bottom of the CM4983 Charcoal square to make one Block Two. (figure 11) Repeat to make a total of ten of Block Two.

Quilt Top Assembly

12. Sew two Block One and two Block Two together alternately to make Row One. Repeat to make Rows Three and Five.
13. Sew two Block Two and two Block One together alternately to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.

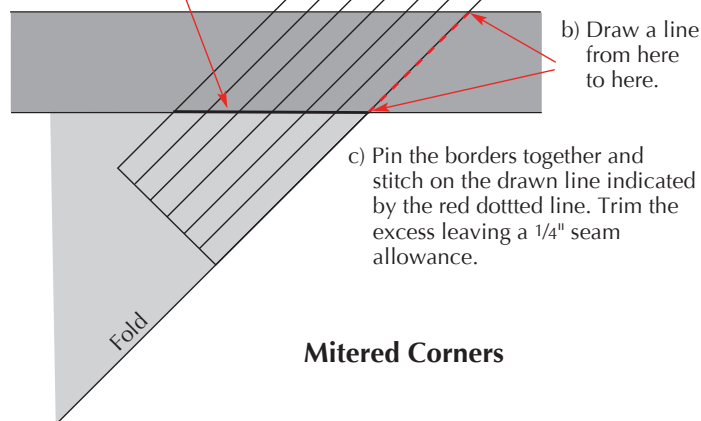
14. Sew the five rows together in numerical order to make the Center Block.
15. Sew one 2" x 60½" CM2959 Cream strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one 2" x 51½" CM2959 Cream strip to the top and the other to the bottom of the Center Block.
16. Center one 4½" x 75" CM4983 Charcoal strip on one side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
17. Repeat step 16 to sew one 4½" x 63" CM4983 Charcoal strip to the top and the other to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter the borders, fold one corner of the quilt on a 45° angle so that the border strips are directly on top of one another and the seams nest together. Place your rotary ruler on the fold of the quilt so that the long edge is against the fold and the 45° line is on the side seam. Draw a line from the corner of the quilt top to the outside edge of the border. Pin the borders together.

Position your needle on the inside corner where the border meets the quilt. Stitch directly on the line you have drawn to the outside edge of the border.

Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Press. Repeat the process for the remaining three corners of the quilt. (figure 12)

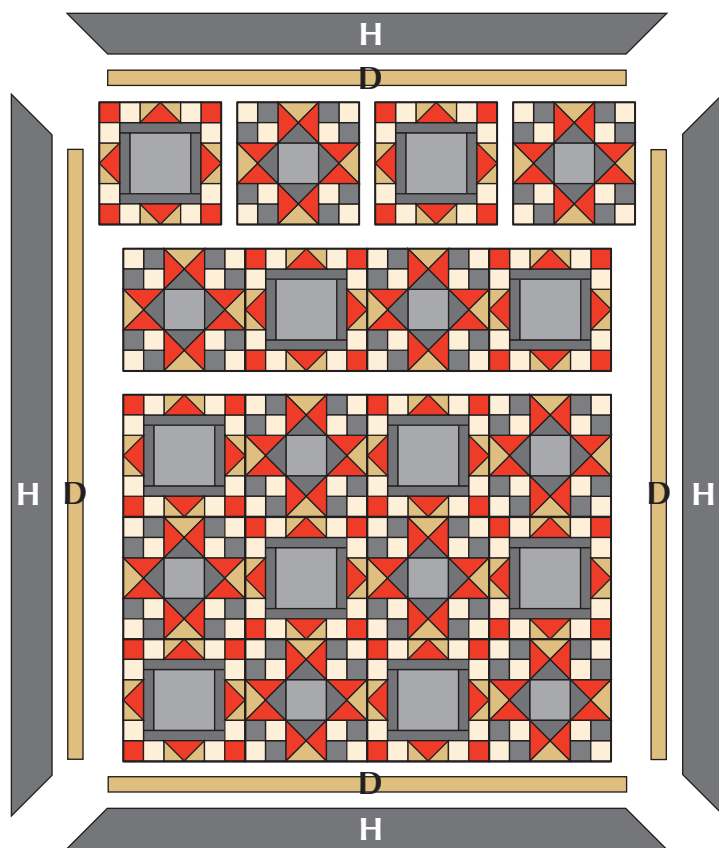

Finishing

18. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing and quilt as desired.
19. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
20. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.
