## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Half-Square Triangle has been abbreviated to HST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

#### From Fabric A, cut:

ten 3" x WOF strips. Subcut:

one hundred twenty 3" squares for the HSTs thirteen 2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

four 2" x 41" row sashing strips fifteen 2" x 9-1/2" block sashing strips Sew the remaining five strips together, end-to-end, then trim: two 2" x 51-1/2" side outer borders two 2" x 44" top/bottom outer borders ten 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" rectangles forty 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles

#### From Fabric B, cut:

one 3" x WOF strip. Subcut: twelve 3" squares for the HSTs one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 2-1/2" squares

#### From each of Fabrics C-H, cut:

two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: eighteen 3" squares for the HSTs one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: twelve 2-1/2" squares

#### From the Binding Fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

# Assemble the Half-Square Triangles (HSTs)

**Step 1:** Pair a 3" Fabric A square with a 3" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew 1/4" away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make twenty-four A/B HSTs.



#### Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make:



thirty-six A/C HSTs





thirty-six A/E HSTs



thirty-six A/F HSTs



thirty-six A/G HSTs



**Step 3:** Gather: one Fabric B square three A/B HSTs

Arrange in two rows of two to form a four-patch, as shown, noting the orientation of the HSTs. Sew together to form rows, pressing the seams in opposite directions. Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the row seam to one side.

Repeat Step 3 to make:



eight from Fabric B



twelve from Fabric C



twelve from Fabric D



twelve from Fabric E



twelve from Fabric F



twelve from Fabric G



twelve from Fabric H

Assemble the Blocks

## Step 4: Gather:

four completed Step 3 units, from Fabric B two 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" Fabric A rectangles one 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" Fabric A rectangle

Arrange the units as shown. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.





**Step 5:** Sew two HST units together, placing a  $1-1/2'' \times 4-1/2''$  Fabric A rectangle in between. Press toward the A rectangle. Repeat to make a second unit like this.



**Step 6:** Sew completed Step 5 units together, placing the 1-1/2" x 9-1/2" Fabric A rectangle between. Press toward the A rectangle.

**Step 7:** The resulting block should measure 9-1/2" square. Repeat to make a total of: two Fabric B Blocks three blocks from each of Fabrics C-H

## Assemble the Quilt



**Step 8:** Arrange the Blocks together as indicated in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew each row together, using sashing strips between each block. Press seams toward the sashing. Repeat to make five block rows.

**Step 9:** Sew the sashing and block rows together. Press seams open or to the sashing.

**Step 10:** Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
