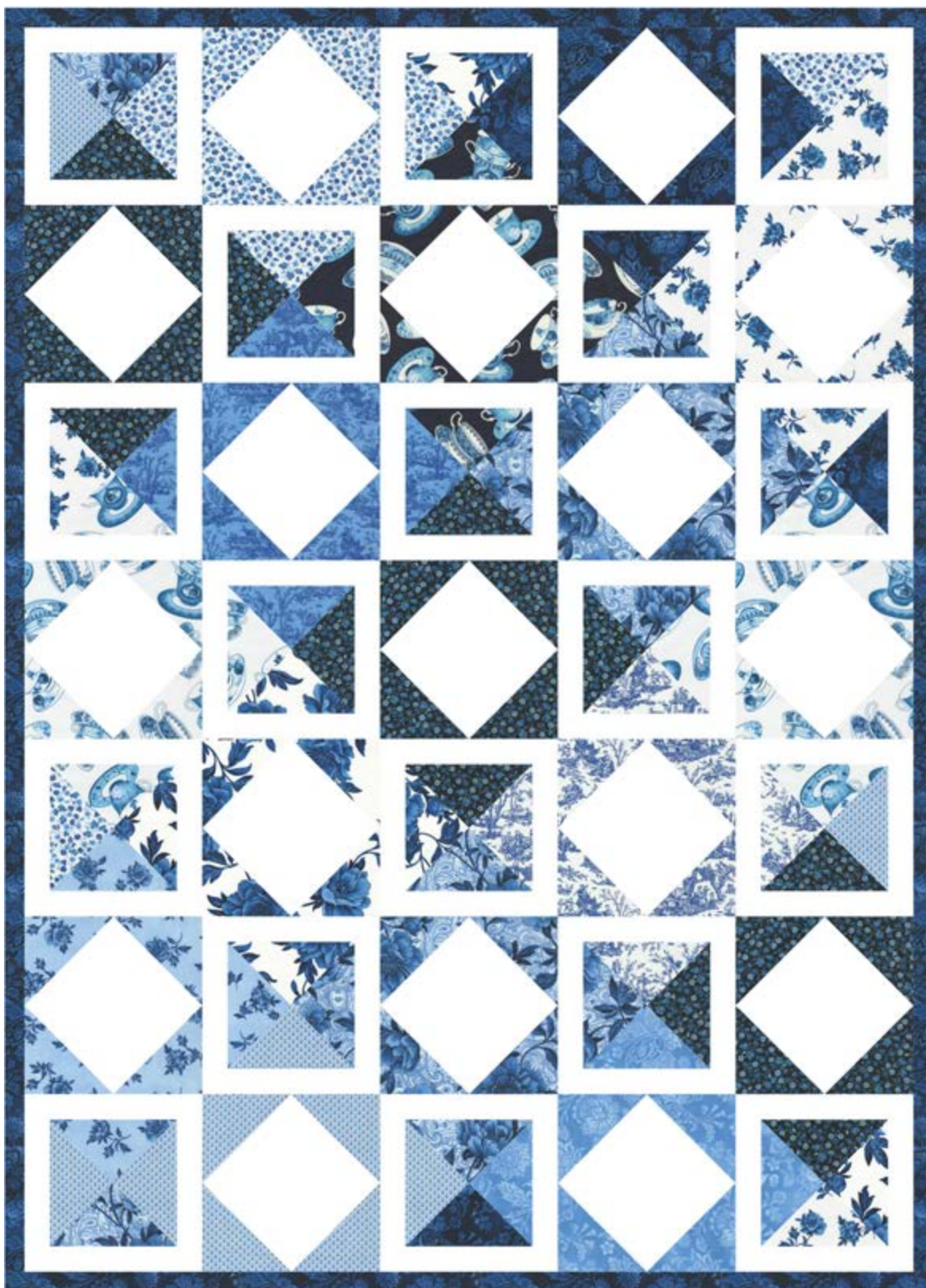

Fabric Requirements:

1/4 yard each:

Blue-C4271 White
Blue-C4793 Navy
Blue-C4270 White
Paris-C3788 Blue
Blue-C4793 White
Blue-C4266 White
Paris-C3788 White
Blue-C4270 Sky
Geo-C4272 White
Blue-C4268 Blue

1/3 yard each:

Blue-C4271 Navy
Blue-C4266 Blue

1 yard Blue-C4268 Navy (includes binding)

1 yard Soho-White

2⁵/₈ yards backing fabric of your choice

46" x 60" batting

Cutting

From each Blue-C4271 White, Blue-C4270 White, Blue-C4266 White, Geo-C4272 White:

- Cut two 6¹/₄" squares.
- Cut two 4³/₈" squares.

From each Blue-C4793 Navy, Paris-C3788 Blue, Paris-C3788 White, Blue-C4268 Blue, Blue-C4270 Sky:

- Cut one 6¹/₄" squares.
- Cut two 4³/₈" squares.

From Blue-C4793 White:

- Cut two 6¹/₄" squares.
- Cut four 4³/₈" squares.

From Blue-C4271 Navy:

- Cut three 6¹/₄" squares.
- Cut six 4³/₈" squares.

From Blue-C4266 Blue:

- Cut three 6¹/₄" squares.
- Cut four 4³/₈" squares.

From Blue-C4268 Navy:

- Cut two 6¹/₄" squares.
- Cut two 4³/₈" squares.
- Cut seven 1¹/₂" x WOF strips for narrow border.
- Cut six 2¹/₂" x WOF strips for binding.

From Soho-White:

- Cut seventeen 5¹/₂" squares.
- Cut twelve 1¹/₂" x WOF strips for block borders.

Block Construction

All seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted. For ease of handling, stack and label patches and blocks by color combination. Note the indication of placement within the quilt.

Diamond in the Square Blocks:

1. Each finished block requires two matching 4³/₈" squares and one 5¹/₂" Soho-White square. To make the block, cut two 4³/₈" matching squares in half once diagonally. Stitch one half to each side of the 5¹/₂" Soho-White square. Press. Make a total of seventeen 7¹/₂" blocks in the colors listed below. (figure 1)

Make three blocks:

C4271 Navy (Block 1 Row 2, Block 3 Row 4, Block 5 Row 6)

Make two blocks each:

C4266 Blue (Block 4 Row 3, Block 3 Row 6) and C4793 White (Blocks 1 and 5, Row 4).

Make one block each:

C4271 White (Block 2 Row 1)

C4268 Navy (Block 4 Row 1)

C4793 Navy (Block 3 Row 2)

C4270 White (Block 5 Row 2)

C3788 Blue (Block 2 Row 3)

C4266 White (Block 2 Row 5)

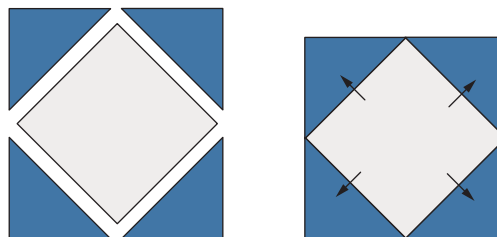
C3788 White (Block 4 Row 5)

C4270 Sky (Block 1 Row 6)

C4272 White (Block 2 Row 7)

C4268 Blue (Block 4 Row 7)

Diamond in the Square Block

Make 17 assorted.

Framed Hourglass Blocks:

3. Cut all the 6¹/₄" squares in half twice diagonally to make quarter-square triangles (QST), keeping patches of same color together and labeled.
4. Following the stitching order below and the quilt photo, stitch two QST together and press the seam. Stitch the next two QST together and press the



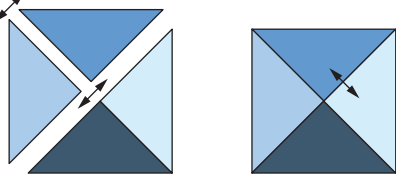

seam. Join the triangle pairs to form the hourglass block. (figure 2)

- C4272 White and C4271 Navy; C4271 White and C4266 Blue (Block 1 Row 1)
- C4271 White and C4793 Navy; C4268 Navy and C4266 White (Block 3 Row 1)
- C4268 Navy and C4270 White; C4270 White and C4271 White (Block 5 Row 1)
- C4271 Navy and C3788 Blue; C4793 Navy and C4271 White (Block 2 Row 2)
- C4793 Navy and C4266 Blue; C4270 White and C4268 Navy (Block 4 Row 2)
- C4270 White and C4793 White; C3788 Blue and C4271 Navy (Block 1 Row 3)
- C3788 Blue and C4271 Navy; C4266 Blue and C4793 Navy (Block 3 Row 3)
- C4266 Blue and C4793 White; C4268 Navy and C4270 White (Block 5 Row 3)
- C4793 White and C4266 White; C4271 Navy and C3788 Blue (Block 2 Row 4)
- C4271 Navy and C3788 White; C4793 White and C4266 Blue (Block 4 Row 4)
- C4271 White and C4270 Sky; C4266 White and C4793 White (Block 1 Row 5)
- C4266 White and C4266 Blue; C3788 White and C4271 Navy (Block 3 Row 5)
- C3788 White and C4271 Navy; C4272 White and C4793 White (Block 5 Row 5)
- C4270 Sky and C4272 White; C4266 Blue and C4266 White (Block 2 Row 6)
- C4266 Blue and C4268 Blue; C4271 Navy and C3788 White (Block 4 Row 6)
- C4272 White and C4266 Blue; C4272 White and C4270 Sky (Block 1 Row 7)
- C4272 White and C4268 Navy; C4268 Blue and C4266 Blue (Block 3 Row 7)
- C4268 Blue and C4270 White; C4266 White and C4271 Navy (Block 5 Row 7)

Note: You will have some leftover triangles to use in another project.

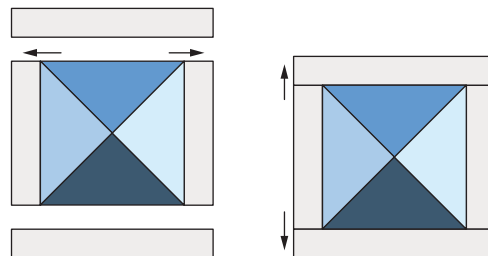

Hourglass Block Center
Make 18 assorted.

5. Border each hourglass block using the 1 1/2" x WOF Soho-White strips. Stitch side borders first, then trim excess length; repeat for top and bottom borders, pressing all seams toward the borders. (figure 3)

Quilt Top Assembly

6. Following the quilt photo, lay out seven rows of five blocks each, alternating the Framed Hourglass blocks and Diamond in the Square blocks as shown. Note the orientation of the blocks to make the overall patterning. Stitch the blocks together in each row. Press seams in alternate directions for adjacent rows.
7. Sew the rows together in order, matching adjacent seams.
8. To make the border, sew seven 1 1/2" x WOF C4268 Navy strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Stitch a border strip to each side of the quilt center and trim the extra length. Press seams toward the border. In the same manner, stitch one border to the top and another to the bottom.

Finishing

9. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing and quilt as desired.
10. Stitch the binding strips together end to end using diagonal seams. Fold and press the resulting long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Stitch to the quilt front, matching raw edges and mitering the corners.
11. Fold the binding to the quilt underside and hand-stitch the folded edge to the quilt back.

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
